<p>The Health and Physical Education program delivers 2 lessons a week for each Year 4 class.</p> <p>At the start of term 1 in PE, students are introduced to range of physical challenges where teamwork, co-operation and getting along are central themes. The activities are designed to make students better thinkers, communicators, risk-takers and team oriented.</p> <p>Students will then build and refine their fundamental movement skills (FMS) to attempt more complex skills and movement challenges as they transition to a Game Sense approach to learning. This term, our sporting focus will be Striking & Fielding (Cricket).</p> <p>During this term, students will undertake fitness testing (The Beep Test) as a base starting point to then try to improve throughout the year with a strong focus on effort and goal setting.</p> <p>Please note: our annual school Years 3-6 Swimming Carnival will be held this term on Friday 23rd March (Week 9) at the Burnside Outdoor Pool – we hope to see you all there!</p> <p>In Health, students will be exploring healthy choices and managing their wellbeing.</p> <p>Joe.Kisiel522@schools.sa.edu.au</p>	<p>During term 1, we will be focusing on language and culture in the units....</p> <p>Siamo tutti diversi (We are all different) and preparing for Multicultural Week in week 8.</p> <p>This term we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use Italian to respond and share information about the origin of their name, themselves and their background • Explore traditional Italian children’s games and associated language • Engage in daily routines and use classroom language with peers and teacher • Participate in intercultural experiences such as songs, games and dance • Recognise, practise and apply knowledge of Italian sound combinations, pronunciation and intonation when speaking, reading and writing 	<p>Year 4 students will be using systems thinking to learn about digital systems through a unit of work that breaks down as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Brief History of Digital Systems. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about the early development of digital systems with a focus on data storage. This will be hands on with original historical artefacts. • What is a digital system? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify digital systems as the many different devices and their peripheral devices that they interact with every day. They understand software as the instructions that make a digital device work. • How the parts work together as a system. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify all of the hardware and software that make up a digital system and how they work together as a system. • Peripheral devices. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explore, recognise and describe a range of digital systems and their peripheral devices and understand that different types of data can be transmitted in different ways.
